The general education core component of the AA or AS degree, if completed successfully with a grade “C” or better on each course, shall be portable and transferable as a block from WPCC to all UNC institutions whether or not the student has earned the associate degree. Upon transfer, students who complete the general education component shall be considered to have fulfilled the institution-wide, lower division requirements of the receiving institution. **Students completing the 44 SHC core should petition to receive the Transfer Core Diploma.**

Upon completion of the AA or AS degree, including the general education core component and approved electives, students will be eligible to transfer to all UNC institutions with junior status, normally 64 SHC.

Students who wish to do so may select a pre-major plan of study from those listed below. Upon completion of the AA or AS degree, students who meet the requirements of the pre-major, including the general education component, will be eligible to be considered for admission as a junior in that major within all UNC institutions that offer the baccalaureate degree. **YOU ARE NOT REQUIRED TO SELECT A PRE-MAJOR AREA OF STUDY.**
