

Requirements

Core 44 College Transfer Pathway

To be eligible for enrollment a high school student must meet the following criteria:

- Be a high school junior or senior;
- Have a weighted GPA of 3.0 on high school courses;
- Demonstrate college readiness on an assessment or placement test in **English, Reading, and Mathematics**;
- Meet all program prerequisites;
- Enroll in one (1) Core 44 College Transfer Pathway program of study.

To maintain eligibility for continued enrollment, a high school student must:

- Continue to make progress toward high school graduation and
- Maintain a 2.0 GPA in college coursework after completing two courses.

A student:

- May only change his or her pathway during CCP registration for fall semester with approval of the high school principal or his/her designee and the College's Director of Enrollment Management.
- May **NOT** substitute courses in one program for courses in another.
- With approval of the high school principal or his/her designee and the College's Director of Enrollment Management, may enroll in BOTH a Core 44 College Transfer Pathway program of study and a Career Technical Education program of study.
- With approval of the high school principal or his/her designee and the College's Director of Enrollment Management, who completes a Core 44 College Transfer Pathway while still enrolled in high school, may continue to earn college transfer credits leading to the completion of the 44-hour general education transfer core.

Career Technical Education Pathway

To be eligible for enrollment a high school student must meet the following criteria:

- Be a high school junior or senior;
- Have a weighted GPA of 3.0 on high school courses or have your principal's approval with a weighted GPA of 2.5 to 2.9;
- Demonstrate college readiness on an assessment or placement test in **English, Reading, and Mathematics**.
- Maintain a 2.0 GPA in your college courses.
- Meet all program prerequisites.

Tuition

Tuition for courses in approved pathways will be waived; however, the student is responsible for student fees as well as the cost of books. Nonpayment of fees will result in the cancellation of a student's classes. Payment of fees is due the day of student's registration.
